It's important for us to know of anyone diagnosed (and have an Educational, Health Care Plan (EHCP), medical certificate or formal diagnosis letter), or have suspected disabilities or difficulties, during the interview, so we can request for any adjustments as early as possible, usually the awarding bodies record this information when you are registered on the apprenticeship/for functional skills and request that any adjustments are applied for at this point too.

It's important to note that we are an equal opportunities provider and any disclosures made do not affect the decisions made at interview.

What Reasonable Adjustments are there?

- A reader and/or scribe for examinations.
- Coloured paper/pens or the use of overlays.
- Printed materials/use of ICT.
- Increased font sizes on assessments.
- Extra time for assessments and examinations.
- Assessments in Braille or a BSL interpreter.
- Changes to assessment methods for example; changing a written task to a recorded discussion with your tutor,
